Understanding the Survey

Domains

The pilot MI Student Voice: Parent/Guardian Perception Survey consists of five domains: Interpersonal Relationships, Parent/Guardian Involvement and Support, Parent/Guardian Satisfaction, School Climate, and Belonging.

The Domain-level report shows an overview of domain responses categorized by gender identity, race/ethnicity, education level, and the child's grade.

The Question-level report breaks down each domain into their individual questions. Responses are then categorized by gender identity, race/ethnicity, education level, and the child's grade.

Scale

Parents/Guardians answered questions using two different scales: Frequency Scale and Perception Scale.

A frequency scale measures the rate at which something occurs. The five-point scale is associated with a numerical value in order to find the average response to each question and domain. The higher the average, the better the student experience.

- (1) Almost Never
- (2) Rarely

(3) Sometimes

(4) Often

(5) Almost Always

A perception scale measures how a student feels about a subject. The five-point scale is associated with a numerical value in order to find the average response to each question and domain. The higher the average, the better the student experience.

(1) Not At All

(2) Slightly

(3) Somewhat

(4) Quite

(5) Extremely









Next to each bar chart are several key insights.

- Average: The mean of responses for the school/district is calculated by adding all student responses for the question/domain and dividing by the total number of respondents (n).
- **Consortium Avg.:** The mean of responses for all participating districts within the consortium is calculated by adding all student responses across the state and dividing by the total number of respondents in the state (*n*).
- % Positive: The percent of positive responses (any student who answered 4 or
 5) are added together.






